Advent Candle - Peace

O come, O come, Immanuel, and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lonely exile here, until the Son of God appear.

Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel, shall come to you, O Israel.

Call to Worship (Inspired by Zechariah 3:6) We come to prepare the way; The way for Christ – the hope of Christ, the peace of Christ – to enter our world, to enter our hearts. We cry out together in the wilderness: The kingdom of heaven has come near. We come to be part of the light– the light that shines in the darkness.

Welcoming Prayer

Most merciful God, we acknowledge our need for rescue, healing, and liberation from all that seeks to separate us from You. In the security of your loving embrace, we confess our sins and the sin of the world which we participate in. Too often we do not place our complete trust in your provision and act selfishly out of fear rather than love. Too often we rely on our own insufficient strength and are unable to resist being formed by the fallen systems of the world.

> Loving God, we turn to you For forgiveness, healing, and liberation. Set us free to serve you in the world, And share the Love of Christ Through acts of compassion and justice. Amen.

#77 Go Tell it on the Mountain

Mark 1:1-4 ¹ The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ. ² As it is written in the prophet Isaiah, "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way, ³ the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight,'" ⁴ so John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

Mark 1:5-8 ⁵ And the whole Judean region and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him and were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶ Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the strap of his sandals. ⁸I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

¹⁰ Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet; righteousness and peace will kiss each other.

¹¹ Faithfulness will spring up from the ground, and righteousness will look down from the sky.

¹² The Lord will give what is good, and our land will yield its increase.

¹³ Righteousness will go before him and will make a path for his steps.

Lord, we give you thanks.

(Specific prayers of thanksgiving may be offered aloud)

God our Mother we know you hear our prayers and long to gather us under your wings like a mother hen. By your Spirit you are at work in our lives for us and with us and in us. We thank You for your steadfast love and faithfulness. **Amen**. The Lord's Prayer
